- Familiarity with Clean Rivers/MFSA equipment List, mutual aid equipment and equipment available through letter of intent.
- Complete River tour for familiarity with equipment locations, member facilities and staging areas.
- Familiarity with current Area Contingency Plan and ability to demonstrate retrieval of information.
- Familiarity with current Emergency Procedures and Bylaws (Article 9) of Clean Rivers Cooperative. CRC Response Manager Manual.
- Familiarity with the current MFSA Oil Spill Response Plan.
- In a drill, exercise or real event, act as a division group supervisor. Demonstrate the ability to achieve prescribed tactics and familiarity with ICS-204 and ICS-214 forms.
 Type III incident would be a Maximum Most Probable or Worst-Case Discharge Scenario.
